Blazers, led by our own follow-and-make-your-own-path, **Gerry Raycraft**!



Guest Speaker: Suisun City Manager Greg Folsom



State of the City of Suisun City

Greg shared: "FY 2018-19 was a good year with a lot of projects accomplished. The General Fund budget includes Police, Fire, Administration, Parks, and Development Services. Revenue sources include taxes, fees, grants, state & federal funding.

Police comprise 66.5% of GF Revenue with wages 30% lower than other agencies (though we catch up somewhat when total compensation is considered.) Fire accounts for

28.3% of GF Revenue. We have transitioned into a Paid/Volunteer hybrid model that has resulted in adding 5 paid positions and a part-time inspector to the department over the past two years.

Our greatest challenge, long-term and through today, is an inadequate revenue stream. Measure S, which passed in 2016 and increased the City's sales tax rate by 1%, generates approximately \$2.2 million, but sunsets in 2026. Given a current operating deficit of roughly \$2.4 million (including Measure S monies), the Council has been

grappling with putting a new tax measure on the ballot to increase sales taxes by ³/₄ cent. With only three council members supporting the measure – Mayor Wilson, Mayor Pro-Tem Williams and Councilmember Adams – it failed (a 4/5ths vote is required to place a tax measure on the ballot.) Staff is now exploring alternatives from deep operating cuts and increasing various fees to new development (Suisun's second hotel continues to move forward.) Disincorporation would be a worst-worst case scenario that wouldn't occur for several years into the future."
